

Pediatric MS has increased globally. The symptoms of MS, considered an adult disease, are not necessarily identified as MS in children. Diagnosis is challenging due to, for example, the similarity of the symptom profile to other childhood demyelinating diseases.

Getting a diagnosis may even take years, causing delays in a child's treatment and rehabilitation. An undiagnosed progressive disease can cause significant additional challenges for a child's ability to function, attend school and for their future.

The incidence of pediatric MS varies in different parts of the world. It is, however, estimated to be underdiagnosed in the Nordic countries. According to estimates, for 3–10% of MS sufferers the disease started in childhood. Childhood MS specialists are few and far between. Now there is an opportunity to hear several of them at a time.
