In early 2024, IOMSN conducted a survey of nurses to assist in developing an action plan for the organization. We felt it was critical to seek input, to stay current and to ensure we were providing services, that both offered benefit and were being sought after. The survey was

emailed to current members of IOMSN and was offered virtually and on paper to attendees of the 2024 IOMSN Nursing Roundtable at CMSC. We are extremely pleased the response rate from a varied group of nurses.

As a result of the survey, the Board of Directors has formed a Roundtable Taskforce to assess and plan practical approaches to a number of the suggestions made.

3. List three areas where IOMSN can improve the services provided to MS clinicians.

Three main themes evolved in the suggestions provided.

First and foremost, nurses requested engagement in different forums, mentorship, buddy programs, preceptorships, peer support, networks and other forms of support. This is a general call for an improved sense of community within the organization.

Second, our respondents had many suggestions for education and learning opportunities for nurses and patients. We were provided with some creative new ideas.

Last, nurses identified a need for better communication and promotion of IOMSN, it's benefits and resources. Many of the suggestions for resources have already been developed or exist. This is reassuring to us, but our challenge is awareness.
