Brief Description of Your Project:

This program focuses on a multidisciplinary approach to patient and family education throughout the journey of multiple sclerosis. It includes in person and zoom (as we serve all of Southern Alberta) educations sessions once per quarter, peer support groups and an online portal for up to date, evidence-based information regarding MS. Our information sessions include general information, DMT, lifestyle, sexual health, exercise with our physiotherapist, managing spasticity, mental health and other effects of MS. The goal of our education session to ensure our patients and their families feel supported throughout different life stages and phases of MS. We aim to empower our patients and their families to allow MS to be a footnote in their lives, rather than dictate it!
